## Councils & Committees (If interested in helping, please check the corresponding box)

- AHBA Remodelers** - meets on the second Thursday of every month  
The Remodelers of the AHBA is an organization of professional remodelers and industry associates. Their mission is to advance the remodeling profession by providing a forum for remodelers to address issues affecting the industry and provide education, certification and service to the membership, industry and community.
-  **Note: There is a \$30 fee imposed by NAHB to be a member of the Remodelers PLEASE INCLUDE PAYMENT WITH YOUR MEMBERSHIP DUES.**
- Associates Council** - meets on the first Thursday of every month  
The Associates Council strives to increase value for Associate members through: enhancement of networking opportunities, identification of valuable sponsorship opportunities, and the hosting of annual events.
- Builders Council** - meets on the third Tuesday of every month  
The Builders Council is dedicated to addressing issues that directly influence the ability of builders to construct efficient and affordable homes.
- Create a Community Committee** - meets as needed; more frequently during the time of the event (February)  
This Committee hosts a *Create a Community Contest* for area 5th and 6th graders. Students create posters of their ideal communities, which are then judged by construction industry professionals for awards.
- Developers Council** - meets on the second Wednesday of every month  
The Developers Council is dedicated to addressing issues that specifically affect the development of residential building lots or subdivisions.
- Education Committee** - meets on the first Tuesday of every month  
The Education Committee develops seminars and educational events to provide members with learning opportunities. They also conduct an annual search to award a \$4000 college scholarship to a graduating high school senior.
- Golf Committee** - meets as needed; more frequently during the time of the event (July)  
The Golf Committee is responsible for planning and managing the annual tournament held each July.
- Government Affairs Council** - meets on the second Tuesday of every month  
The Government Affairs Council aims to better the industry by identifying legislative and regulatory issues, making recommendations on political appointees, and by encouraging changes to regulations and local political issues.
- Home Show Committee** - meets as needed; more frequently during the time of the event (March)  
The Home Show Committee is responsible for the development and management of the annual AHBA Home & Remodeling Show.
- Membership Committee** - meets on the third Wednesday of every month  
The Membership Committee is responsible for the recruiting and orientation of new members, maintaining the retention of current members by keeping them active and informed, and planning general membership meetings and an annual Spike function.
- Parade of Homes Committee** - meets as needed; more frequently during the time of the event (August)  
This Committee is responsible for planning and managing the annual AHBA Parade of Homes and POH Banquet.
- Spring Preview of Homes Committee** - meets as needed; more frequently during the time of the event (March)  
This Committee is responsible for the planning and management of the annual AHBA Spring Preview of Homes.
